Meet the Members, No 4: Peter Hendry

My name is Peter Hendry, My background is engineering, Beginning as an apprentice at Scanners _a branch of Marconi's at Gateshead. I did a course in toolmaking which entailed using Harrison and Myford Lathes.

Then 12years working for the GPO in telephone and exchange maintenance in Sunderland and Northumberland. During the bad winter of 1963 we moved to Bardon Mill a very small village west of Hexham . I drove a Land Rover and looked after the remote TV microwave stations between Newcastle and Carlisle.

In 1968 we moved to Otley when Yorkshire TV was being set up. I started a month before we went ON AIR.

Working in Telecine and Video Tape departments I supervised a crew of engineers in the central transmission area. This covered all aspects of recording, editing and transmission of programmes and commercials as well as Outside Broadcasts.

After 26 years I took the opportunity to leave and became a professional photographer which kept me busy until recently when as demand has declined I decided to give up and enjoy retirement, hence woodturning.

I joined the Outer Circle in January. When visiting the Woodworking Show at Harrogate. I was tempted to buy a lathe, something I always thought I might do one day.(I made a few items at an evening class about 40years ago!) After careful deliberation I took the plunge and went back the following day and ordered an SIP.lathe from TOOLSTOP -- 1.2 HP motor, swivel headstock, cast iron bed, variable speeds, 36" between centres and 12" swing over bed. Also an oak bench at a give away price. Then onto chisels I got a great set of the new "Powder steel" from Crown. Since then I have lashed out on a "Dakota." A Tormek "look alike" wetstone grinder and a Scroll chuck both from "RUTLANDS" who I could recommend. After insulating my garden shed and putting power in I am now up and running!.
