1. Turn between centres to a cylinder, Make a chuck spigot on one end.
2. Mount in chuck. Turn basic shape. Turn chuck spigot on top end.
3. Mark division line
4. Part in middle

5. ...Mount lid in chuck and hollow out

6. Sand & finish inside of lid

7. Mount base in chuck and hollow.

8. Fit together and shape box.

Meet the Members—John Boyle—Hon Sec



John was born in Co. Durham in 1936 but swiftly moved with his parents and siblings at the tender age of 3 years to live in the "premier" county and was adopted as a Yorkshireman, and he now lives happily in Wyke.

He received a grammar and technical college education in the Wakefield area and was initially employed as a trainee chartered accountant in that City.

He served for a number of years as a member of the Sovereigns' Escort in The Life Guards, Household Cavalry Regiment in London and abroad.

On leaving the army he joined the West Riding Constabulary (later West Yorkshire Police) and served for 31 years, almost exclusively as a Detective, retiring as a senior CID officer. Throughout his career he was engaged in many differing investigative spheres and was involved in many high profile matters, more notably as the interrogative and charging officer in the case of the serial killer, Peter William Sutcliffe (known colloquially as The Yorkshire Ripper).

Since retiring from the Police John has until recently been engaged as an Investigative Consultant to the Legal Profession.

He has been married to Marie for 52 years, and they have two sons, both Cambridge University graduates, who are Chartered Accountants and partners in respective Business Management and

Information Technology concerns.

He took up woodturning as a hobby in 1994 and joined the Woodturning/Woodworking Courses at Bradford College in 1995 under the tutelage of our now Chairperson, Phil Garlick, until the courses ended in 2006.

His main turning interests, besides the usual output, include chairmaking, (Windsor and Captains chairs, stools, some involving steambending), indented letter carving, wooden cart construction, toy making, and general furniture restoration etc.

He has been the Club honorary secretary since its inception in January 2007, and together with the committee, was responsible for its formation and maintenance and subsequent successful application to the National Lottery and Bradford Council, for funding which resulted the Club being able to furnish itself with a comprehensive array of modern turning equipment.

His domestic hobbies include gardening, pond fish and home improvements.

The Annual Competition— 24th November 2010

The competition will take place on 24th November 2010. For the first time the competition will be judged by a professional turner who will be Tracey Owen this year.

- There will be the usual three categories, beginners, intermediate and seniors.
- The competition is restricted to members of the club
- All entries in all sections will be a BOWL, 9" or under and the finish/decoration will be own choice. *A Bowl is defined as a deep basin shaped object, i.e. pudding bowl, fruit bowl, mixing bowl etc. In turning terms it must remain functional even if it has been decorated by some means or other.*
- Members can submit two entries .
- Entries to be brought on the day
- There is no entry fee.
- No names to be marked on the items
- Any item having won in any other major competition will not be allowed.

There is a returnable Trophy for the winner of each section together with prize money for the first and second place in each section.

There is a non-returnable trophy given to the best improver in the club.

The prize money will be as last year £20 first prize in each section and £10 second prize in each section.
