Summary of the Annual General Meeting—January 2011

Officers:

Joey Richardson was elected as President
 Treasurer Graham Bowman agreed to stand again and was re-elected
 Bob Swaine was re-elected as the Members Representative on the committee
 The Appeals Committee was re-elected en bloc.
 Eric Mann and Paul Wheeler were elected to carry on as Trustees
 Bob Swaine, Derek Kirkland and Paul Wheeler will continue as Equipment Officers
 Doug Hirst re-elected as Librarian
 Audio visual - Peter Hendry will take on the job assisted by John Andrews

Chairmans Report : We have had a good year, with good attendances and quality demonstrations which covered a wide area of expertise. The Annual competition had a good turnout and the standard in all sections was of a high standard. Thanks for your efforts.

We need to amend our constitution to include the post of President. We count ourselves fortunate to have amongst our members a young lady who we have invited to be our first president. She is an international demonstrator and sells her work in some of the best galleries of the world. Her association will add prestige to the club and her reputation as a turner is acclaimed worldwide.

Joey replied saying that she was attracted by the friendliness of our club and looked forward to joining us when she could.

Thanks are due to all who have worked to further the aims of our club, especially John, Graham, Doug Hirst and the ladies in the kitchen. The work done by Bob Swaine and Derek Kirkland is greatly appreciated by us all.

The Treasurer presented his audited accounts for the past year and reported that despite the small increase in membership fees during the year, the financial situation is on a sound footing and should be able to cope with normal running costs.

The Secretary thanked all the members for their efforts and support during the past year and outlined the calendar of events/ demonstrations for 2011. He also commented on the excellent Xmas Buffet at the Robin Hood Hotel, the members were united in their acclaim for their enjoyment of the venue and high quality of food available.

Items by unanimous vote:

- In order to extend the time scope of training projects/ demonstrations it was agreed that the Club's duration of meetings should be extended from 1pm-3pm to 12noon until 3pm at an extra membership cost of 50p per meeting and that the extension will be effective from the first meeting in March 2011 for the foreseeable future.

- From 2011 an entry fee of £2.00 will be charged per person in the Annual Club Competition.
- A discussion followed re the inadequate electricity power supply to the lathes, and the secretary agreed to explore the matter in-house in conjunction with the Centre Management.
- There was a discussion re the possible financial viability of having a separate Club Open Day at the Wyke Centre to advertise the Club's activities, and to display and sell members items to the public. **It was agreed that, at the present time, and considering that the financial outlay and members efforts involved would not be justified, we should concentrate our efforts on promoting/organising an Open Day to be held on a normal Club meeting date** and report back on the possibility.
- It was suggested that the club should draw up a list of equipment to be procured.
